



by Atinuke


A baby and her brother take a basket full of bananas to visit their baba, and the baby sees many different animals along the way, including butterflies, birds, and baboons.

by Sandra Boynton



The first in a new black-and-white board book series tells about the journey parents take that leads them to their perfect little one.




### Nom Nom Nom : A Yummy Book With Flaps


"NOM NOM NOM"!

by Lucy Cousins




### I Love You, Baby Burrito

by Laurie Elmquist


Celebrates the sights of the city that baby can see riding in a stroller, including bustling streets, crowded restaurants, and quiet parks.

by Akio Kashiwara


Draws on decades of research and application in a high-contrast board book for newborns that uses strategic bold shapes and colors to promote receptive language skills and sound associations.

by Annie Kubler


Presents an illustrated version of the traditional nursery rhyme about a teddy bear, depicting friends playing in the garden.

by Rina Singh


A photographic board book reveals the onomatopoeic words for heartbeats in different cultures while exploring the heartbeat's universal message of life and love.

by Nicola Slater


In this fun lift-the-flap book, play a game of hide-and-seek while you share in storytime together. There are so many places to hide!

by Katy Tanis


Love is love wherever it's found. This fun and inclusive book celebrates all forms of love found within the animal kingdom.
