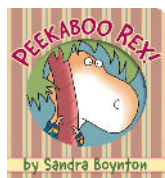

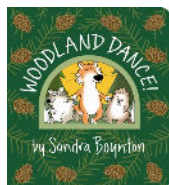

by Sandra Boynton

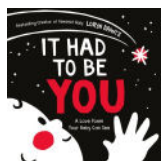
Two lovable dinosaurs play peekaboo throughout the day, in this fun-filled board book that showcases every toddler's favorite hide-and-seek activity.

by Sandra Boynton

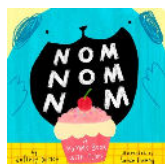

by Loryn Brantz

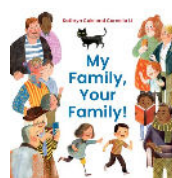
The first in a new black-and-white board book series tells about the journey parents take that leads them to their perfect little one.

by Jeffrey Burton

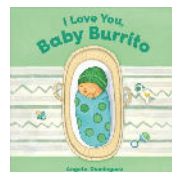

by Kathryn Cole

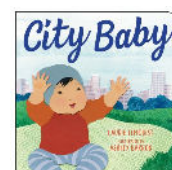
This book includes a diverse array of characters and celebrates gay parents, single parents, blended families, and other family groups rarely seen in board books.

by Angela Dominguez

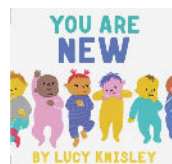
This sweet celebration of the arrival of a new baby depicts the love and care that goes into gently swaddling a newborn to keep them warm and cozy, like "a baby burrito."

Celebrates the sights of the city that baby can see riding in a stroller, including bustling streets, crowded restaurants, and quiet parks.



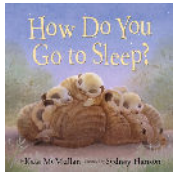
### You are New

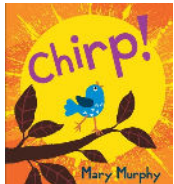

by Kate McMullan

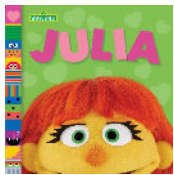

by Andrea Posner-Sanchez

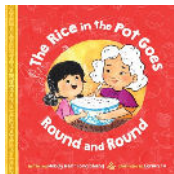
Meet your favorite Sesame Street friends in this board book starring Julia, a muppet with autism!

In this interactive touch-and-feel book, meet seven cute animals who all feature terrific tails!

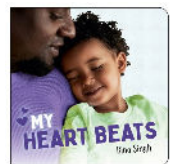


### The Rice in the Pot Goes Round and Round

gather to prepare food, slurp noodles, press tofu and tap chopsticks to the tune of "The Wheels on the Bus."

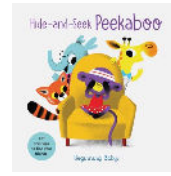


### My Heart Beats

A photographic board book reveals the onomatopoeic words for heartbeats in different cultures while exploring the heartbeat's universal message of life and

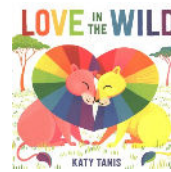

by Nicola Slater

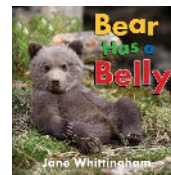
In this fun lift-the-flap book, play a game of hide-and-seek while you share in storytime together. There are so many places to hide!

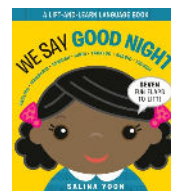
